Gilpin Hall Nursing Home Long-Term Care Facility Fiscal Year Ended June 30, 2018

What Was Performed? An examination of the Gilpin Hall Nursing Home's fiscal records of the Delaware Department of Health and Social Services, Division of Medicaid and Medical Assistance, Medicaid Long-Term Care Facilities' Statement of Reimbursement Costs for Skilled and Intermediate Care Nursing Facilities – Title XIX and Nursing Wage Survey (cost report and nursing wage survey, respectively) for fiscal year ended June 30, 2018.

Why This Engagement? This engagement was conducted in accordance with federal requirements (42 CFR 447.253 and 483 Subpart B) and state requirements (Title XIX Delaware Medicaid State Plan, Attachment 4.19D) (criteria), as applicable to the Gilpin Hall Nursing Home's fiscal records. The criteria were used to prepare the Schedule of Adjustments to the Trial Balance, Patient Days, and Nursing Wage Survey for fiscal year ended June 30, 2018 found in the report.

The State of Delaware is required to ensure that the fiscal records at the nursing care facilities are retained and properly support the cost report, or the financial report showing the cost and charges related to Medicaid activities, submitted to the Medicaid Agency. These costs must be compliant with federal and state regulations. Under the Delaware Medicaid State Plan, the state is required to examine a sample of facilities located within the state to ensure the facilities' cost reports and nursing wage surveys are compliant with federal and state requirements.

What Was Found? It is my pleasure to report that there were no findings identified and the Gilpin Hall Nursing Home Long-Term Healthcare Facility complied, in all material respects, with the criteria mentioned above.

We have examined management's assertions that Gilpin Hall Nursing Home (Provider) has complied with federal requirements (42 CFR 447.253 and 483 Subpart B) and state requirements (Title XIX Delaware Medicaid State Plan, Attachment 4.19D) (criteria), as applicable, relative to the provider's fiscal records of the Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS), Division of Social Services, Medicaid Long-Term Care Facilities' Statement of Reimbursement Costs for Skilled and Intermediate Care Nursing Facilities – Title XIX and Nursing Wage Survey (cost report and survey, respectively) for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018. The provider's management is responsible for the assertions and the information contained in the cost report and survey, which were reported to DHSS for purposes of the criteria described above. The criteria was used to prepare the Schedule of Adjustments to the Trial Balance, Patient Days, and Nursing Wage Survey. The accompanying Schedule of Adjustments to the Trial Balance, Patient Days, and Nursing Wage Survey were prepared from information contained in the provider's cost report for the purpose of complying with the DHSS's requirements for the Medicaid program reimbursement, and is not intended to be a complete presentation in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America.

In our opinion, except for the items listed as adjustments on the accompanying Schedule of Adjustments to the Trial Balance, Patient Days, and Nursing Wage Survey for the period cited, management's assertions referred to above presented in accordance with the criteria, in all material respects.

We have examined management's assertions that Gilpin Hall Nursing Home (Provider) has complied with federal requirements (42 CFR 447.253 and 483 Subpart B) and state requirements (Title XIX Delaware Medicaid State Plan, Attachment 4.19D), as applicable, relative to the Provider's fiscal records of the Department of Health and Social Services (DHSS), Division of Social Services, Medicaid Long-Term Care Facilities' Statement of Reimbursement Costs for Skilled and Intermediate Care Nursing Facilities – Title XIX and Nursing Wage Survey (cost report and survey, respectively) for the fiscal year ended June 30, 2018, and have issued our report thereon dated June 14, 2022. We conducted our examination in accordance with attestation standards established by the American Institute of Certified Public Accountants and the standards applicable to financial examinations contained in *Government Auditing Standards*, issued by the Comptroller General of the United States of America.

Internal Control Over Reporting

In planning and performing our examination, we considered the Provider's internal control over financial reporting in order to determine our examination procedures for the purpose of expressing our opinions on management's assertions, but not for the purposes of expressing an opinion on the effectiveness of the Provider's internal control over financial reporting. Accordingly, we do not express an opinion on the effectiveness of the Provider's internal control over financial reporting.

A deficiency in internal control exists when the design or operation of a control does not allow management or employees, in the normal course of performing their assigned functions, to prevent or detect and correct misstatements on a timely basis. A material weakness is a deficiency or combination of deficiencies in internal control, such that there is a reasonable possibility that a material misstatement of the cost report or survey will not be prevented, or detected and corrected on a timely basis. A significant deficiency is a deficiency, or a combination of deficiencies, in internal control that is less severe than a material weakness, yet important enough to merit attention by those charged with governance.

Our consideration of internal control over financial reporting was for the limited purpose described in the first paragraph of this section and was not designed to identify all deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that might be deficiencies, significant deficiencies or material weaknesses. We did not identify any deficiencies in internal control over financial reporting that we consider to be material weaknesses, as defined above.

Compliance and Other Matters

As part of obtaining reasonable assurance about whether the Provider's cost report and survey are free of material misstatement, we performed tests of its compliance with certain provisions of laws, regulations, contracts and grant agreements, noncompliance with which could have a direct and material effect on the determination of reported amounts. However, providing an opinion on compliance with those provisions was not an objective of our examination, and accordingly, we do not express such an opinion. The results of our tests disclosed no instances of noncompliance that are required to be reported under *Government Auditing Standards*.
